# The Biblical View of Social Justice: "How to Live the Best Life"

The United Nations is an organization formed in 1945 to promote world peace and serve as a forum where nations can join forces to tackle international problems in a cooperative manner. One of the main concerns of the U.N. has been human rights. "Human rights" has been

the terminology used in its pronouncements and documents since its inception but, in the second half of the 1960s the term began to be replaced with the phrase "social justice". In a document entitled **Declaration on Social Progress and Development** the authors offer a concise history of the concept of social justice:

"[T]he notion of social justice is relatively new. None of history's great philosophers—not Plato or Aristotle, or Confucius or Averroes, or even Rousseau or Kant—saw the need to consider justice or the redress of injustices from a social perspective."

From what perspective then did they view justice and the redress of injustices? It was viewed as a personal quality of harmony and peace in the inward man. Ancient philosophers like Plato [458 B.C.], Socrates, Aristotle and Epicurean addressed these questions and came up with what they believed were theoretical and practical solutions. The solution was sought by asking the question: "what is the best way to live" or how does one achieve a *virtuous* life. Plato thought about the question and came up with a concept that he called *justice*. he defined justice as a state of harmony where warring factions within a man were at peace. So, as we can see, the term "Justice" was first applied to the individual. A just person was one who was at peace with himself. In other words, there were no wars going on in his conscious.

This state of *justice* made it possible for there to be peace and harmony in the larger society. Predictably, people who have not achieved a state of justice [peace and harmony] within themselves cannot contribute to justice in society because eventually, the wars on the inside of them will spill over into the larger community in the form of antisocial behavior and violence. Among philosophers and thinkers of the ancient world, achieving a state of personal justice on the inside of the individual was the best way to live. Achieving inner peace was the key to achieving justice [peace and harmony] within the larger community outside of the man.

In this article I want to begin to look at God's answer to the question of *how to live the best life* and explore God's concept of how to achieve justice in society. I want to begin by looking at the story of the creation in the book of Genesis.

In the story of Adam and Eve we can begin to understand the issues involved in arriving at an answer. God made Adam and Eve and put them in the garden and told them: "...of all the trees you may freely eat but of the tree in the midst of the garden thou shalt not eat of it; for in the day that you do, you will surely die" (Genesis 2:17).

Satan insinuated that their situation did not afford them the chance to live the best life. He implied that God was holding out on them and, denying them the opportunity to reach their highest potential. He implied that God was denying them access to knowledge and that He was denying them the opportunity to achieve equality with Him. Satan's idea of how they were to discover their best self is revealed in the narrative of his dialog with Eve (Gen 3:1-8). It is his answer to how to achieve one's highest state of existence and achieve what Plato would come to call *justice* within. Satan's answer was to throw off the shackles of being bound to the system that God had set up.


<sup>4</sup> "You will not surely die," the serpent said to the woman. <sup>5</sup> "For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." **Genesis 3:4-5** (NIV)

Their eyes did become open, and they did come to know good and evil. The problem was they did not acquire the power to bring about good nor to deal with the evil that followed. That power remained solely in the hands of God. Plato would say, they lost *justice* within. The peace and harmony that they had on the inside was lost and the peace which they had with God and with each other was also damaged.

Their collective conscious was gripped by guilt; selfishness surfaced in their hearts; and, they began to shift blame away from themselves toward others. Eve blamed the serpent and Adam blamed Eve and insinuated that God was the blame for his failure because it was He that gave him the woman.

This defect was passed along to their children and we read in **Genesis 4:1-8** (KJV) the account of how Cain followed his parents in rejecting God's right to dictate the terms of their relationship. In so doing he lost inner peace [justice] and soon the turmoil on the inside spilt over in the form of violence toward his brother Abel.

In our next article we will explore the details of the story and see how they relate to the ancient quest of finding justice and answering the question: what is the best way to live? †
